- Judgment against injustice
 Woe to those who enact evil statutes, and to those who
 constantly record unjust decisions. 10:1
 - Deprive the needy of <u>justice</u>.
 - Rob the poor of their <u>rights.</u>
 - <u>Plunder</u> orphans.
- The "Woe" factor. prevarication
 - The "woe to" judgments are used 19 times in Isaiah
 - "Woe is me" is used once. _____.
 - Is. 5: 18-23. *Woe to those, who...*
 - Matt. 23:13-23. Woe to you, <u>Pharisees</u>, because you . . .
- Prevarication:
- Judgment against abuse of power
 - Assyria: a nation assigned by God to be the instrument of His purpose, which was to chasten and scourge Judah and Israel. 10:5-6
 - But, this nation elected to exalt itself beyond God's purposes, and said "glory to us, we are the greatest." 10:8

• THE UNREPENTANCE OF THE NATIONS

- That which is being judged here is not just plain old sin, but rather the <u>arrogant</u>, <u>haughty</u>, <u>and unrepentant</u> abuse of privileges and powers granted to the nations by God Himself.
 - 10:6, God <u>commissioned</u> Assyria.
 - 10:7, but Assyria purposed in its heart to <u>destroy</u>, and to cut off <u>many</u> nations.
