And the Point Is?

- Do we see the contradiction, or perhaps the paradox, of God's attitude and treatment of Israel and Judah in the text?
 - Does God appear to vacillate from kindness to harshness, from forgiveness to judgment?
 - Is there a consistent factor in God's "behavior?"
- The "Loud Silence."
 - How many people "wonder" but don't ask?
 - Do we fear we might be "questioning" God? (Is there a difference between questioning God and asking him a question?)
 - If the contradiction is apparent, why do you suppose God showed it to us?
- Competing Opinions
 - Secular Humanism: There is <u>no God</u>, its just bad history and fable.
 - **Liberalism**: this is just a story, a biblical tale to demonstrate the difference between "good" and "bad" behavior.
 - **Fundamentalism**: God can do <u>whatever he wants</u>, because he's God.
 - **The World**: this just shows that God, if there is one, is inconsistent and untrustworthy.
 - **Ignorance**: We're not sure, we just know that God is loving and wouldn't ever do anything to <u>hurt us.</u>
